
Stephen and Erika Jones

It was a great event. It was a hot day, but that made it great for the kids playing in water. The gospel was shared, and each person received a small Gospel tract with a wordless book bracelet. The soccer field looks greatly improved after the sanding and treatments it has received over the last two months. It is thick and lush now. There are still a few spots with some thick sand, but over time, the grass will continue to get better. Mowing continues to be a weekly task, but Caleb and Jim help most weeks unless something comes up. A few weeks ago, Jim became ill and was hospitalized for a few days and had to take a break for a couple weeks from strenuous activities. He is helping again now, but please pray for him as he continues recovering.



In Colombia, I got word from Pastor Alfredo with the Mobile Unit in Santa Marta. They are showing a movie about once a month. He says they are so grateful that God provided them with this tool, and are excited to be able to use it for evangelism. Pastor Alex also sent us an update, and they are really engaging with the families and youth in Chorrillo. They have transported some of the families to attend worship service at the church, and are also teaching some beginner music classes to the youth on different instruments: guitar, keyboard, and even drums. God continues to work and reach the people in Colombia through various avenues. We are so thankful for His wisdom and will! Continue to pray for lasting change in these lives!
